

Poster Presentation Guidelines

Graduate Student Presentations – Tuesday, August 4, 2009

The Poster

1. The poster may be no more than 36" tall X 48" wide.
2. The poster must be a single sheet of paper; it may be matte, glossy or laminated, but must be flexible to roll up for transportation to the conference.
3. Cite INBRE and NIH on your poster. Use the INBRE and NIH logos as well as the logo of your host institution. Format and logos are available to you via the web:

**INCLUDING A FUNDING CITATION IS
MANDATORY ON ALL POSTERS.**

4. Poster Format should include:
 - Title
 - Authors and Institution(s)
 - Abstract
 - Background information
 - Hypothesis (if appropriate)
 - Materials and methods
 - Results
 - Discussion
 - Conclusion
 - Signatures: you and your mentor on the back of the poster

The Day of Registration

Monday, August 3, 2009

1. It is your responsibility to bring your final/signed poster to the Conference.
Undergraduates - You will hang your own posters the afternoon of Monday, August 3, 2009.
Graduate Students – You will hang your own posters the afternoon of Tuesday, August 4, 2009.
Push pins will be available.
2. At Conference registration you will be asked to submit an electronic copy of your final poster. Bring the file on a USB Drive, ready to transfer to our computer. Name the file "LastName FirstName Poster 2009". The file you submit at registration will be retained by Idaho INBRE for our records.

The Day of Presentation

1. Undergraduates - The poster viewing sessions will be Monday, August 3rd from 4:00 to 6:00 pm and 8:00 to 10:00 pm.
2. Graduate Students – The poster viewing session will be Tuesday, August 4th from 3:15 – 6:00 pm.
3. You may choose when to stand by your poster during the sessions. You are not required to stay by your poster for the whole session as we would like you to have a chance to look at the other posters.
4. Be prepared to discuss your research project.
5. No laptops or models are allowed. Your presentation consists of your poster and your ability to discuss it.
